- 2. Approval of minutes from February 25th meeting. Motion to approve as written: Hilmas; Second: Insall. Approved.
- 3. Committee Reports
 - a. President's Report
 - i. End of Year Banquet award process: President Newkirk is accepting nomination for the two Graduate Studies Excellence Awards (One for staff; one for faculty). Members of the graduate faculty should nominate deserving candidates through their departmental graduate coordinator. More details on this will be sent via email. Each recipient will receive a \$100 gift card, along with a plaque of recognition.

- a. Graduate Catalog Updates: GFC reviewed updates to the catalog language for non-degree seeking students, MS Teacher, etc. (See attachment) Move to approve: Newkirk, Second: Insall. Friendly amendment: Weidner (accepted) that an extra listing of 6099 be removed from the MS Teacher update. Discussion focused on whether there were loopholes in the current language for non-degree seeking students. There were also concerns that the MS Teaching lacked rigor. President Newkirk tabled as outside of the motion. Hilmas moved to vote, 2nd by Huang. Approved.
- b. Graduate Forms Updates: GFC reviewed updates to Graduate Forms (Form 1 and Continuous Registration). President Newkirk moved to accept. Friendly amendment (Corns, 2nd by Worsey)

was accepted to remove 5099 from Continuous registration Form. Motion to vote: Weidner, Second: Hilmas. Approved.
