Three general proposals to consider:
a) How to handle emeritus faculty? When emeritus status is bestowed, it is viewed as appropriate that emeritus faculty would have a "lifetime", voting membership as graduate faculty members.
b) How do handle exiting employees (i.e., one-year continuation/adjunct appointments)? Want to clarify the rules to avoid undue hardship to students. Two-year associate membership automatically.
c) How do handle removal of committee member? Dept chair make request with justification and decision is made by dean of graduate school.
